## **PROJECT OVERVIEW**

The Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) is completing preliminary design of a bridge replacement project along South Moonlight Road over I-35 and the realignment of 183<sup>rd</sup> Street in Johnson County.

Replacement of the existing bridge is necessary, as the structure is past its useful design life. Additional benefits of the project are reducing future maintenance needs, enhancing safety and allowing connectivity from South Moonlight Road to a nearby paved shared-use path to carry bicyclists and pedestrians over the bridge.

The project will connect to a nearby paved shared use path in southeast Gardner to carry cyclists and pedestrians across the new bridge.
