SCOPE: REHABILITATE PAVEMENT & ADD SHOULDER

Project Overview:

The K-156 project will begin four miles west of the U.S. 283 junction in Jetmore to 228 Road north of Hanston. This project will include adding shoulders, rehabilitation of the existing pavement, and improving roadside safety. The safety improvements include; wider travel lanes, 6 foot composite shoulders, improved sight distance and flatter roadside slopes.

During the Kansas Department of Transportation's Local Consult meeting held in 2019, local stakeholders identified K-156 as one of the transportation priorities for the region. This portion of K-156 was chosen due to its lack of shoulders, steep roadside slopes, regional importance and safety history.


