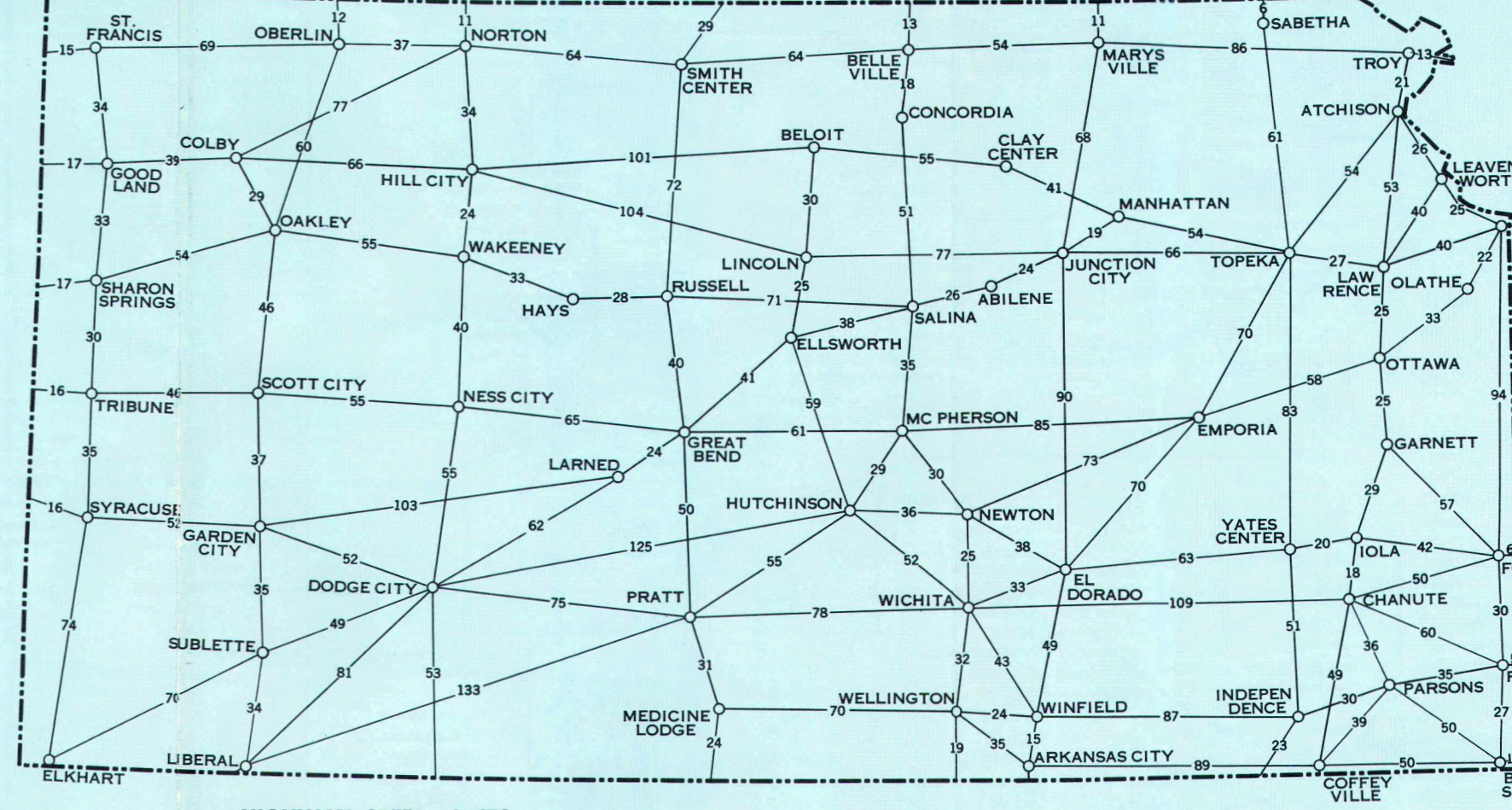
KANSAS OFFICIAL HIGHWAY MAP

State Parks; Lakes; Federal Reservoirs

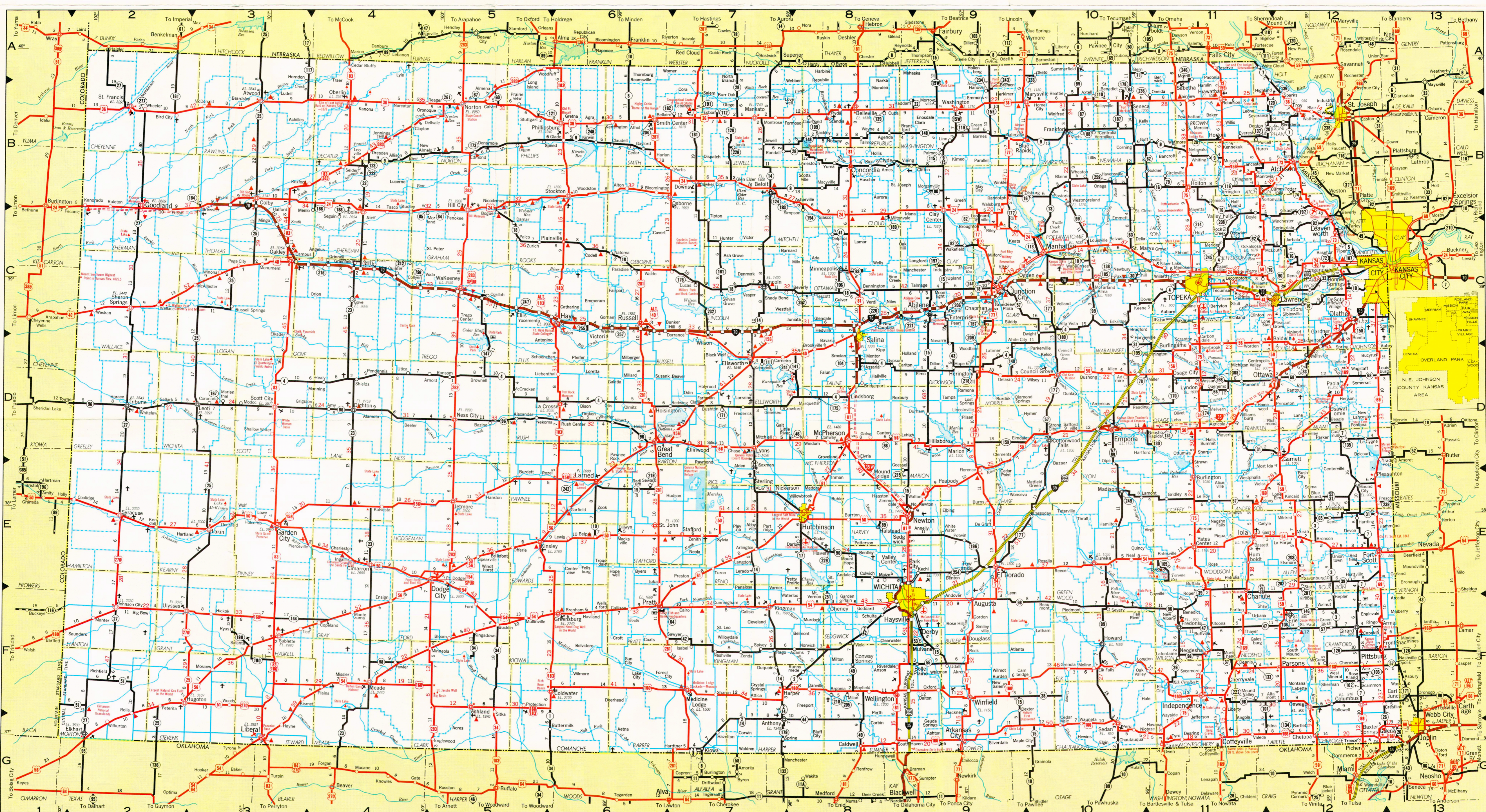

Distances shown on Mileage Map are the shortest routes using U.S. and Interstate highways. Toll road mileage is not included but use of the Kansas Turnpike will reduce distances on many trips.



Recreation available at State Lakes and Federal Reservoirs includes fishing, swimming, boating, picnicking, and camping. Better facilities are available at State Parks on a fee basis.

Free overnight camping is also allowed in all Highway Safety Rest Areas that have rest rooms.

**SAFETY RULES IN KANSAS**

The State Highway Commission annually works thousands of manhours and spends millions in highway user funds to build and maintain the best possible roadways for the traveling public, but the safest, well marked highway system never will replace a driver's skill or keep him alert.

To assist in the safe movement of traffic, each day Troopers of the Kansas Highway Patrol drive thousands of miles on state highways as a reminder to drivers who see them to take care of the business at hand—safe operation of their vehicles. Motto of the Patrol is "Courtesy, Service and Protection."

**Passenger cars, buses, and trucks under 8,000 pounds:** 70 m. p. h. day, and 60 m. p. h. night on US and K routes. Interstate Routes, 75 m. p. h. day and 70 m. p. h. night with minimum day or night 40 m. p. h.

**Trucks over 8,000 pounds:** 60 m. p. h. on US and K routes; Interstate Routes 60 m. p. h. with minimum of 40 m. p. h. day or night.

**School Buses:** 45 m. p. h.; on activity trips on paved highways 55 m. p. h.

**Kansas Turnpike:** All vehicles 80 m. p. h. with 40 m. p. h. minimum.
