

GREENSBURG (F-6) World's Largest Hand-Dug Well-Walk to the bottom of 1885 109 ft. well.

Kansas Cosmosphere and Space Center— World's largest collection of space suits, complete set of original spacecraft, Omnimax movie theater.

LARNED (E-6) Ft. Larned National Historic Site—Built in 1859 to protect the Santa Fe Trail, buildings restored to original appearance. Santa Fe Trail Center—history of the Santa Fe Trail and lifestyles of early day Kansas

LINDSBORG (D-8) Birger Sandzen Memorial Gallery-displays works of internationally praised Swedish-American painter. Coronado Heights-Coronado once camped

here in search of the Seven Cities of Gold. Old Mill Museum—restored Smoky Valley Roller Mill and Swedish Pavilion; National Historic


